The Kingwood Community and Population

The Kingwood community is located 26 miles northeast of Houston. It is a planned community of about 70,000 people. All economic levels are represented, though most residents are employed in professional or managerial occupations.

Northeast Christian Academy

Northeast Christian Academy was founded in 1993 as an independent, co-educational, college preparatory day school for elementary, middle and high school students. It is evangelical and interdenominational. Admission is selective. NCA provides an excellent academic and spiritual foundation for a college bound student.

Accreditation

NCA is fully accredited by ACSI, Association of Christian Schools International and Southwest Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), which are approved by the Texas Private School Accreditation Commission. NCA is also a member of Christian Schools International (CSI), Humble Area Private Schools (HAPS), and the Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS).

NCA has a faculty of 30 elementary and secondary teachers who are college graduates with concentrated preparation in the major subject areas they teach. At the high school level, students are offered varying levels of instruction: College Preparation (L), Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP).
