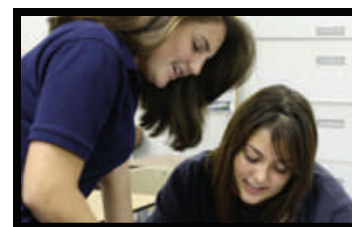
Humanities Division at NCA

The specific methodology of the high school Humanities experience emphasizes the imparting to our students a mastery of certain skills rather than a mere memorization of facts and data. It is a **precise method of directed dialogue**, sometimes known as the Harkness Method. This learning is centered around a very large "Harkness table" and is very process-oriented. It involves planning, outlining, reviewing, peer-editing, questioning, rehearsing, etc.—all with intensive teacher involvement at each stage of the process. Teachers are dedicated to the success of their students as each step of the process is accomplished.

NCA employs 34 highly qualified faculty and administrators who are college graduates with concentrated preparation in the subject areas they teach. 30% of the faculty and administration have earned post-graduate degrees. Average class size is 15.
